

HAT SIZE MEASURING GUIDE

A tape measure measurement of your head can accurately determine your hat size. Please note that every one-quarter inch or so changes your hat size, so exact measuring is essential for proper hat fitting. Fezzes cannot be returned due to improper fitting.

1. Measure around your head just above the top of your ears. (See Diagram 1)
2. Start in the middle of your forehead and gently wrap the tape measure around your head. (See Diagram 2)

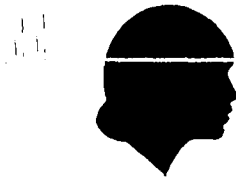

3. The tape measure should sit above your ears and wrap midway on your occipital bone (the bump in the middle of the back of your head). (See profiles below)

4. Don't pull the tape too tightly or your hat will fit that tight.
5. Don't let the tape droop or your hat will be too loose.
6. If possible have someone read the tape measure measurement while still on your head. An exact measurement is necessary for a proper fit.
7. Re-measure 2-3 times for a consistent and accurate measurement.

Refer to the hat size chart below to determine your hat size.

If your head size falls between two measurements, choose the larger size. It is easier to make a fez smaller if it's a little too large than to stretch a fez if it's too small.
